Immigration to Canada

Studying at eligible designated Canadian learning institutions and obtaining an open work permit are important steps toward permanent residence for international students who are looking to make Canada their home. As a Bow Valley College student, you will gain valuable skills and graduate with hands-on Canadian experience that will help you make the transition.

Post-graduation Work Permit Program (PGWPP)

The PGWPP allows students who have graduated from eligible designated Canadian learning institutions to obtain an open work permit to gain valuable Canadian work experience. Skilled real-world training gained through the PGWPP helps graduates qualify for permanent residence in Canada through the Canadian experience class, within Express Entry.

International English Language Learning program

In the International ELL program, you'll learn listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. This program is certified by the Languages Canada Quality Assurance Scheme. The International English Language Learning program offers a pathway from learning general communication skills to a course that introduces you to an academic English to a pathway preparing you for post-secondary studies in Canada. Your initial level placement will be determined by submitting a valid English Language Proficiency Exam result (IELTS Academic, Duolingo, Pearson PTE A, or TOEFL IBT). Students who successfully complete English for Academic Purposes 2 with a grade of "B-" or higher meet the language proficiency requirements for most Bow Valley College, SAIT, and other post-secondary programs.

In this course, you will focus on developing your communication skills. You will engage in Canadian culture while developing listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. You will work on developing vocabulary and grammar skills, sentence structure, speaking naturally, learning English pronunciation, and reading short texts.

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In this course, you will focus on developing your communication skills. 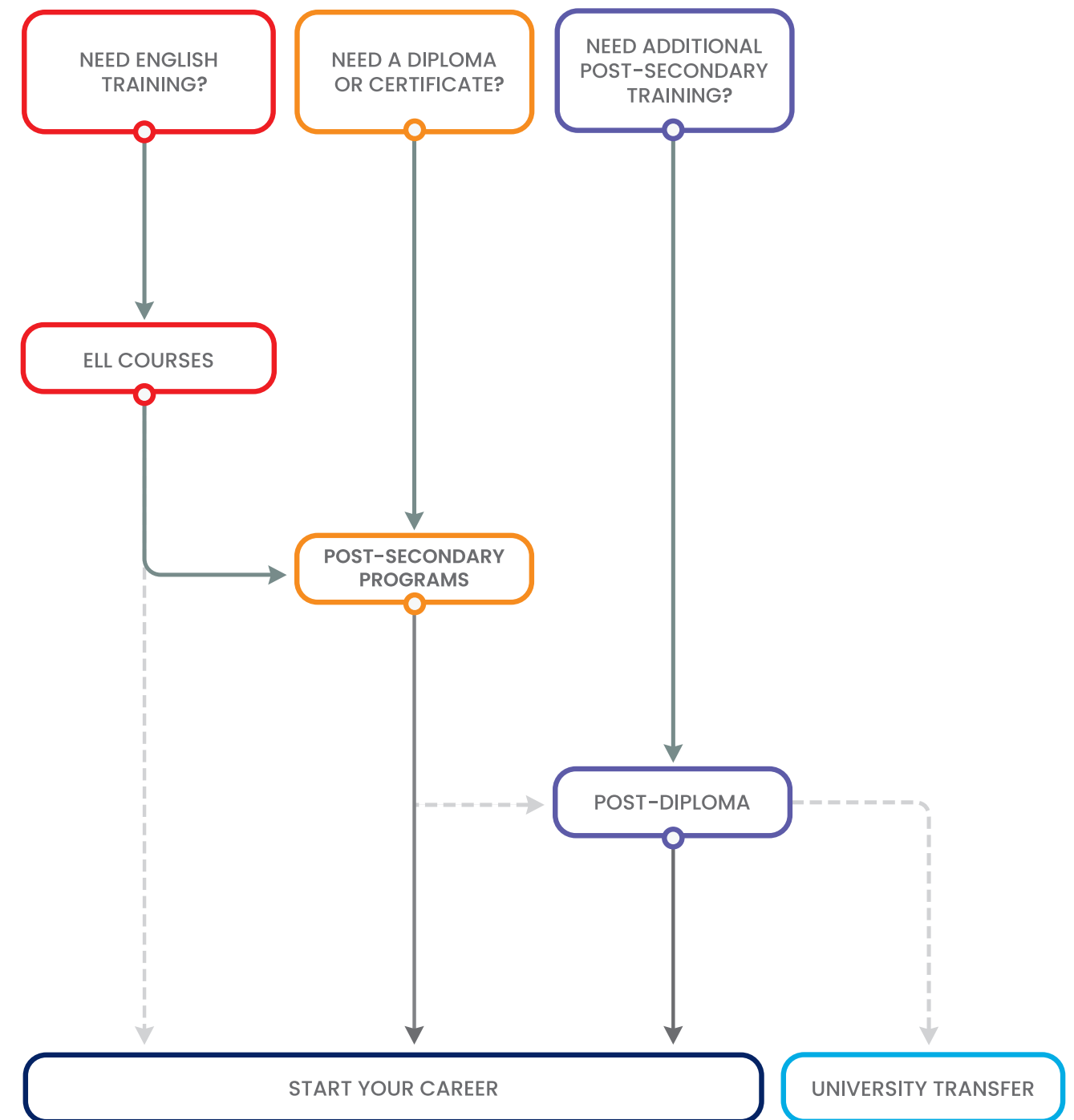
English Language Learning Pathway partnerships

Learner success advisors refer students to resources and services available at the College and in the community.



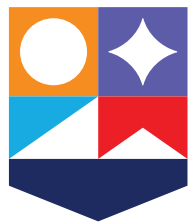
